Sukkot- let's built a tent!!! is the second edition of interdisciplinary architecture workshops celebrating the Jewish Sukkot holiday, organised by Association of Polish Architects branch in Poznań and the Kolektyw 1a Association with the substantial support of the Poznań Jewish Community.

The workshops will take place from the 23rd until the 31st of August 2018 in Poznan. The project's aim is to familiarise participants of the workshops and the residents of Poznań with Jewish tradition and culture in a modern and open form. 32 students of design degrees from Poland, Germany and Israel will participate in the workshops. They will work in small international teams tutored by recognised young designers. Their task will be to design and independently realise, within a set budget, a contemporary interpretation of traditional tent for the Jewish Holiday of Sukkot.

About the 2013 Edition

28 students from all over Poland participated in the previous edition in 2013. They worked on a tent design in four groups. The groups were mentored by young architecture studios of Poznań: Ultrarchitects, Trabendo, UGO architecture and Atelier Starzak Strebicki. Workshops lasted from 17th to 22nd September 2013. During the workshops, design works took place in educational rooms of the National Museum in Poznań. Following the design state, teams started the construction of their structures on the historic square of the Ballet School. Great number of the residents of Poznań took part in the event, especially children living in tenement houses on the Old Town Square, as well as tourists.

The 2018 edition

The workshops will take place between the 23rd and the 31st of August 2018 in Poznan, Poland. This year, 32 students of design degrees from Poland, Germany and Israel are invited to participate in the workshops. The participants will work in 4 mixed international groups. Tutored by young architects and designers from Poland (Adam Gielniak, Adam Wierciński+Agnieszka Owsiany), Germany (Nils Wenk) and Israel (dr Edna Langenthal). Each team will receive a budget of 3 thousand zloty (circa 800 Euro) for the construction of previously designed tent. With guidance of the tutors and organisers, students will independently manage the received budget. Just like in professional life, they will be responsible for the budget, deadlines, materials, deliveries, and execution. Over the course of 8 days of workshops, they will go through the complete process of design and investment, which will become their everyday reality once they graduate. The workshops are accompanied by additional events: debates, architecture walks, and lectures showing that architecture is multidisciplinary task which draws from sociology, culture, nature and heritage. The constructions designed and executed by participants will be presented to a wide audience during the exhibition in the centre of Poznan in the historic Park of the National Museum.

Tutors

Adam Wiercinski Studio- is an architecture studio based in Poznan, Poland. Studio is working with a broad range of projects within the fields of architecture and design. The firm's portfolio includes urban planning competitions, public spaces, private houses, interiors and furniture design. Studio creates unique spaces designed right down to the last detail. Edna is a PhD Candidate in the Department of Philosophy at Tel Aviv University. The subject of her research is Phenomenology of Architecture: Between the ethical and the Poetic; the Meditations of Heidegger and Levinas. She is a lecturer at the School of Architecture at Ariel University Center of Samaria, where she teaches first year studio in architecture, incorporating philosophical and ethical questions.
